BE OUR GUEST is a cooperative education experiential learning program for secondary school students outside the classroom. The program was founded in 2017 by a group of innovative hospitality leaders with the aim of introducing high school students to the inspiring world of hospitality. BE OUR GUEST operates through the collaboration of Ontario school boards, hospitality organizations and is supported by OHI – We Are Hospitality. The program was lunched in Toronto working with the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) secondary schools. Currently the Be Our Guest program includes program in three different schools boards including North York and South Simcoe District School Board with the intention is to expand the reach and impact of the program through further collaborations.
